Following the death of Rudolfo in 1963, she came to New Zealand with her four children. Lina has lived in her own house in Petone for 46 years, and for 19 years, worked at the woollen mills in Petone. Lina is a great cook and she likes nothing better than to have people around for a meal and a glass of wine. She enjoys gardening and you will often find her there – after a visit you will nearly always leave with something from her garden.

Sadly, in 1999 and in 2000 Lina lost two daughters to cancer, 11 months apart, which was a huge blow to her.

To celebrate Lina's 90th birthday family and friends joined her for dinner at the Petone Working Men's Club. Although she has slowed down and now uses a walking stick, she still enjoys a daily glass of wine and pottering in her garden.

ALLA FINE DEL MONDO BOOK SPONSORSHIP AND UPDATE

Writing and editing of the second and revised edition of the book *Alla Fine del Mondo* is almost completed. Paul Elenio has been interviewing a number of the immigrants about their experiences when they settled here and the circumstances that led them to come to New Zealand. The new book will have substantial new material on what were typical experiences of the migrants. There is also a perspective on the wartime labours of migrants growing food for the troops and additional text for the existing chapters on those who owned or ran businesses and on Club Garibaldi's rich 17-year history since the first edition was published in 1995. In all, the new book will have 40 more photographs and about 13,000 more words.

As you would expect, the printing costs for the book are huge and while the club will eventually be reimbursed through sales it would be helpful if members contributed to the cost. We have been delighted with the response to the request in the November newsletter for commercial organisations and family donations. Thank you for your generosity!
