This year marks the 66th anniversary of the birth of the Italian Republic. On 2 June 1946, following the results of a popular referendum, a 'new' Italy was born out of the ashes and turmoil of World War 11, and into the vibrant, free and democratic nation that it is today. Although Italy is a young republic, it is an ancient land of rich culture and great traditions. We have much to be proud of. Club Garibaldi, with other Italian communities worldwide, saluted Italy as we celebrated this special day at our club rooms on Friday, 1 June. Since Italy's Ambassador to New Zealand, H.E. Alessandro Levi Sandri was unable to attend, we had the pleasure of having Donato Scioscioli, Deputy Head of

Mission, representing the Ambassador in his absence. Other special guests included Cav Elizabeth Peek, Mons Emien Jean-Sylvain, from the Apostolic Nunciature. Riccardo and Clara D'Usillio, Delia Benazzo and Carlo Puglia from the Italian Embassy joined us as well.

Unfortunately, as I was in Sydney attending the funeral of a family member, I was unable to be present at this year's celebration, however, Paul Elenio did a great job standing in for me, also acting as emcee for the evening. The formal part of the evening commenced with Robin Page explaining my absence. Paul then welcomed everyone to the club, including a group of Circolo Italiano members, and gave a short speech. This was followed by members standing to sing the Italian National Anthem, Fratelli D'Italia. In reply, Donato Scioscioli, gave a speech, followed by Cav. Elizabeth Peek, President of the Circolo Italiano di Wellington.

Following a delicious finger-food supper served by three pretty young ladies, Sophia and Charlotte Basile and Gabriella De Gregorio, we had a host of entertainers led by Caterina and Adam Costa, Linda De Gregorio, Armando Gilmoni, Gary McFadyen and Robin Page, assisted by a group of impromptu singers including Mario Leonti, Riccardo D'Ausilio Delia Benazzo, Elizabeth Peek, and Ida Basile. FROM THE CLUB'S ARCHIVES

Evening Post – 18 March 1910 – Fire in the City

Fire Brigade Superintendent O'Brien this morning had to deal with a fire which might easily have assumed very serious dimensions. The firemen's ambulance, the scene of the outbreak was a "nest" comprising a cluster of buildings, some of them old and flimsy, plenty of highly combustible materials, and a builder's timber yard. The brigade received the call at 8.9am, and at once proceeded to a lane in Ghuznee Street, at the back of the Club Garibaldi. Here it was found that the upholstery works of Messrs Ivan and Thompson were well ablaze, the seat of the fire being in the kapok. The materials in the place included fibre and cloths of various descriptions, all highly inflammable. The contents of the upholstery works, which were uninsured, were almost entirely destroyed, and the building was damaged beyond repair, but the flames were prevented from doing much further damage. It is owned by Mr John Myers, builder, who occupied the ground floor as a store. The contents were damaged by water. The building, including some structures only slightly damaged by fire and water, are insured for £900 in the Commercial Union Office.

The premises of the Club Garibaldi were damaged by water and slightly by fire getting in at the roof. The club property is uninsured. The ground floor of the club is occupied as a store by Egisto Rondanina, and the contents are insured for $\pounds100$ with the Commercial Union.

Baby gets world's tiniest artificial heart in Rome – First operation of its kind

Doctors in Rome have successfully implanted the world's smallest artificial heart into a 16-month old, reports said Monday. The operation, the first of its kind, used an 11-gram device to simulate heart palpitations before a real heart was later transplanted last month. The child is reportedly in good condition.
