The game: Club Italia 5 Club Garibaldi 2

Youth wins the day

Many a parent will think at times that youth were put on this earth to torment the old, and so it seemed in the Aldo Cuccurullo Trophy game as the youth of Club Italia showed our ageing backline that speed kills – or, at least, completely exhausts, older limbs and lungs.

The youth of Nelson ran rings around Club Garibaldi's backline showing more zip than a trousers factory. The Garibaldi backline, with a combined age of close to 200, was almost reduced to spectators as the dash of the Nelson attack threatened to rip the tie asunder in the first half.

The Nelson pressure eventually produced a breakthrough, with a well-taken goal after a through-ball got in behind the Garibaldi defence. Not long after Nelson extended the lead with a breathtaking, 20 yard curling shot into the top corner of the net from PJ Lupi.

Things were starting to look ominous for Garibaldi, but fortunately we were able to bounce back somewhat, with a well-crafted move that ended in the calm slotting of a goal by Luciano Colucci. Things improved further, when Luciano was again involved, this time, earning a penalty-kick when he was taken down by a clumsy tackle in the box.

Jimmy Haidakis, made like Balotelli with a brilliantly-taken penalty, and suddenly the scores were level again with five minutes till halftime. Immediately after, however, we missed a golden chance to take the lead when Carlo Petagna fired over the crossbar from a handy position. Nelson wasted no time in punishing us for the miss by retaking the lead before halftime, with PJ Lupi, again, the finisher of a nicely-worked move.

Going into the break 2-3 down, we believed we were back right in the game, and hoped the tailing wind would assist our chances, although it did seem like the wind was starting to ease. Both sides had chances, and the game teetered on the brink of either an equaliser for us, or a two-goal cushion for Nelson.

With everything hanging in the balance, something had to give, and it was us who gave Nelson a goal, when a defensive error led to a chance that was not misspent by the youth of Nelson.

At 2-4 down we had no option but to chase the game, but on ever-wearying legs it was always going to be a big ask, and a comeback was not to be. Nelson put the outcome beyond doubt with 10 minutes to go, when some patient interplay around our box led to a smartly-converted goal to make it 5-2.

The goal-scorers for Nelson were all relatively young compared to Wellington. They were P J Lupi, Mark Lupi, Cataldo Miccio and Francesco Cheruseo and it certainly shows the value of bringing youth into the team. Wellington will need to do this if we are to have any chance of reclaiming the trophy in the future, as experience is willing, but leg-speed is killing!

A big thank you to the referee, Salve Basile, and to the linesmen, Benson Oosterbaan, and Peter Lye, who all did a great job of controlling the game.

Wellington put on a wonderful day for the game and the meal at the Club was a sumptuous feast as always. Many thanks to all who contributed to the event, in particular, to Maria Colucci, Paul Muollo and Paul Elenio and everyone who helped out at the dinner.
