This year's club Garibaldi trip took us to the Waikato region for four fun-filled days celebrating our Italian heritage through conversations, music, laughter, food, wine and a real sense of belonging to an extended famiglia italiana. Morning tea at Mangaweka woke us up properly after our early start to il primo giorno and from there the bus became increasingly noisy (that's not hard to imagine with a group of Italians!) as we headed to Taupo for a delicious lunch. Several hours later we arrived at our accommodation in Hamilton to warm weather that continued throughout our stay. Once we'd deposited our bags in our rooms we had free time to socialise in smaller groups, explore the surrounding area and walkways or swim in the pool.

Day 2 started with a cooked breakfast followed by a tiki-tour of Hamilton before attending mass at midday. The beachside suburb of Raglan was our next port of call and we enjoyed lunch and a wander around the shops and beach front followed by a visit to the spectacular Waireinga/Bridal Veil Falls. We enjoyed a short picturesque bushwalk and for some, the challenge of walking over 300 steps to the base of the 55m waterfall. The views were magnificent and the walk back up was a good cardio workout for those who braved the path down. At Caffe Centrale later that night we enjoyed a sumptuous dinner to complete a very enjoyable day.

Another cooked breakfast awaited us the following morning before our visit to the stunning Hamilton Gardens. The Italian Renaissance Garden was being re-constructed (just like visiting places of significance in Italy!) but the Chinese Scholars' Garden; Japanese Garden of Contemplation; English Flower Garden; American

Modernist Garden and Indian Char Bagh Garden were a treat for our eyes, ears and souls. Many of our group particularly enjoyed the expansive Sustainable Backyard Garden. Constructed and maintained mainly by volunteers, it is predominantly a visual spectacle of a working garden organically growing a myriad of vegetables and fruit, which is donated to the local foodbank. Later in the afternoon we were treated to a relaxing cruise along the Waikato River.



Our Italian meal that night was enhanced by the musicality of our own Italian superstar, Salve Gaeta. The only sad note this year was the absence of his piano accordion playing partner-in-crime, Armando Gilmoni who wasn't with us physically but spiritually I'm sure he was enjoying the night and fondly reminiscing about previous club trips and sing-alongs.

Pasta, Prayer & Promise: Book Launch



We invite you to join us for the long awaited Wellington book launch of:

PASTA, PRAYER & PROMISE – the story of Nelson's Italian community 1862-2014.

Nelson's Italians form a small but vibrant community, which is historically significant and nationally important as a distinct migrant group. Yet their place in the city's social, heritage and economic fabric has gone largely unrecognised, until now. Following five years of research and interviewing Pasta, Prayer & Promise records Italian contact with the Nelson region

The city was one of three main centres of early Italian settlement in New Zealand and Italian business people, gold miners, fishermen and farmers can be found living and working in and around Nelson from the 1860s.

Although many became integrated into the wider community, in some cases anglicising their surnames, a second wave of migrants from 1890-1920 developed as a culturally distinct community. It was this group which helped establish Nelson as a major tomato growing area, providing employment and business opportunities for later arrivals. Exploring the subsequent waves of chain migration (the 1950s and more recent

arrivals), Pasta, Prayer & Promise includes the individual family migration stories of 32 families with their connection to the Wellington region.

It charts the development of The Wood's tomato industry over several generations, examining its contribution to national research, through to its eventual demise and the redevelopment of the inner-city land once described as a sea of glass.

Delving into social history relating to family, home, church and school, the authors explore contact with family in Italy (including the arrival of brides); the establishment of Club Italia and its ongoing role as a community hub, and the thorny issue of enemy alien status during World War II.

Painstakingly researched and lavishly illustrated, Pasta, Prayer & Promise examines why Italians chose to leave the country of their birth and travel to 'the ends of the earth' to settle in Nelson, New Zealand. The book is 448 pages, hard back, full colour and will retail at \$55.

The Wellington launch of Pasta, Prayer & Promise will take place **Friday 8th May, 6.30pm** at Club Garibaldi, 118 Tory Street. Cash bar and book sales only. No EFTpos facilities will be available.

Just Like Mamma's

Pizza Dough:

250 ml warm water 1 tbsp dried yeast ½ tsp sugar 400g High Grade Flour 100g fine semolina 1 tsp salt

Put water into mixing bowl and add yeast and sugar. Let it stand in a warm place until yeast has dissolved and mixture is frothy. Mix well. Add flour, semolina and salt. Mix well. Knead for 10 minutes until smooth and elastic. Place the dough in an olive-oiled bowl – cover and let rise.

Roll out onto oiled tray or pizza stone. Add your favourite toppings. Cook in high oven till brown. Enjoy!
