A BIT OF TRIVIA

ANSA - Rome, 18 December 2009

Italy's highest court of appeal said on Friday, that it is illegal to poke your tongue out at someone to insult them. The Cassation Court turned down an appeal by a farmer from the Marche region who claimed his gesture, caught on a camera phone by the neighbour he was arguing with, was 'not offensive' but a mere grimace'. The farmer, Carlo O, was convicted of insulting the other man by a Justice of Peace last year. The Cassation Court said the conviction must stand and Carlo O would have to pay damages to be set in a separate civil trial. Carlo O was ordered to pay his neighbour's court costs of E1300! Insults are taken very seriously in Italy and people are often found guilty of offending someone's honour.

ANNUAL BLESSING OF THE BOATS

Island Bay - traditionally a fishing stronghold in Wellington - will once again, host the annual Blessing of the Boats during the Island Bay Festival on **Sunday, 14 February 2010** at 2.30 pm.

The following is a little history of its origins. The blessing of fishing boats is a tradition in Italy that goes back centuries. In southern Italy, the blessing would be undertaken by the local priest at the start of spring. The boats, many of which were named after saints, were decorated with flags and bunting, would file past to have holy water sprinkled on them while the priest recited prayers and made the sign of the cross. The blessing was part of the religious belief that if the boats received the grace of God, they and the fishermen would be protected from the elements and would also reap the bounty of the sea. Many of Island Bay's Italian immigrants came from the fishing villages of Massalubrense and Puolo in the Gulf of Naples, and the island of Stromboli, near Sicily. Today all sea craft and vessels are welcome to take part in this special ceremony.

PROFILE OF NINA CUCCURULLO, CLUB SECRETARY



I have been a member of Club Garibaldi since 1991 when the constitution was changed to allow women members and prior to this had been a member of the Circolo Italiano of which I am still a member. In 1994 I became the first woman to hold an office bearer's position as the Secretary. This is my 5th year as the Secretary for the Club.

I have been involved in the club through various ways since becoming a member. I worked as the Photographic Researcher and was on the committee for the book 'Alla Fine del Mondo' written by my cousin, Paul Elenio, as well as working with the Petone Settlers Museum for the exhibition on Italian immigrants in the Wellington region.

I have been involved with the Italian Festival since the first one was held at the Petone Settlers Museum in 1994. In 1997 I set up the Language Classes for children at Club Garibaldi and initially helped teach the classes and have just recently stepped down as the coordinator.

I have helped with various research projects on Italian immigrants, and these have included Oral Histories and theses. Over the years I have collected items to begin a Club archive which I hope to develop further with Ginette Toscano Page. From 2003 until 2007 I had the honour of being a member of the Community Advisory Group for Te Papa for the exhibition 'Qui Tutto Bene!'. This was a rich and rewarding experience for me as well as being very hard work!. I continue to have a good working relationship with Te Papa as a result of the exhibition.

I began my career as a teacher, then in 1996 became an Administrator in the Italian and Spanish Programmes at Victoria University, a job which I love as I am constantly surrounded by things Italian and get to meet Italians from all parts of Italy and to learn more about Italy.

In May 2006 I was awarded the *Cavaliere - Stella della Solidarietà Italiana* (Cavaliere - Star of Italian Solidarity) by the Italian Government for services to the Italian community and for promoting the Italian language and culture. This was a great honour for me and my family and I felt proud to receive it on behalf of my parents Antonio and Teresa Cuccurullo and my grandparents, Luigi and Ilma Ruocco, who emigrated to New Zealand from Massalubrense and Capri to make New Zealand their new home.

Being a member of the Club has provided me with lots of rich and rewarding experiences and I hope others will consider being involved with the Club Garibaldi and its various committees.

In the last newsletter we asked members if any of them recalled the eruption of Vesuvius in 1944. Here are some members' memories:

Teresa Elenio recalls in Massalubrense the farmers coming out of the lemon groves black with ash looking like pieces of coal!

Bianca Cassino from Moliterno in the region of Basilicata, some 200 kilometres away says the ash on the ground resembled freshly fallen snow. She was a child at that time on her way to school and this image has always remained with her.

Antonio Cuccurullo from Massalubrense recalls that when Vesuvius erupted the wind direction was south-east and this brought the smoke along the coast and to Massalubrense. The ash stayed for a few days as Vesuvius continued to emit smoke. Antonio recalls the big clean up after the ash and having to wear a hat made out of sacking cloth when harvesting the lemons. The lemons all had to be washed. The ash, Antonio says made the soil more fertile.

We cannot guarantee you a place if you leave enrolment until the General evening on Wednesday 27 January (between 5.30 and 7pm).

The Classes Opening Ceremony for <u>ALL</u> students will be at 6.30pm on Wednesday 3 February 2010 at Club Garibaldi. It is not necessary for Club Garibaldi members to join the Circolo and course fees are offered at the reduced rate of \$155 for 30 fifty-five minute lessons.

The textbook required is: **Buongiorno Italia (2005)** for Beginners Stage 1 and 2. The textbook is available from Whitcoulls Bookstore, (Information Counter) 312 Lambton Quay, Wellington.
