Condolences



Cricketers Arms celebrates 60 years of music

On Saturday 20th April 2024, the Wellington Club Garibaldi will host an exhibition and performances to celebrate the long history of music on this site. The Club Garibaldi, one of the Southern Hemisphere 's oldest Italian Clubs (established 1882), purchased the former Cricketers Arms site from Lion Breweries in 1991. The Cricketers Arms had previously enjoyed a long history of music in its three bars since the 1960s. In 1983, when John Roache was the licensee, the top floor, which currently houses the Club Garibaldi, became the successful "Steinie Bar" under the direction of David Hyams as promotor.

Because of its central location, the "Steinie Bar" was very quickly adopted as the place to play by both local and touring acts. Some of the first groups in the door was *Andrew Fagan and the Mockers. They were quickly followed by the Pink Flamingos, the Narcs, the Legionnaires, Midge Marsden, Primitive Art Group, Rick Bryant and the Neighbours who brought special guests Trudi Green and Sam Ford, The Topp Twins, Sam Hunt, Gary McCormick, the Willie Dayson Blues Band the Netherworld Dancing Toys, Body Electric, The Mangawekeas, The Chills, The Bats, Back Door Blues Band the list goes on and on...*

Since 1992, Club Garibaldi has hosted a succession of musical variety Benefit evenings, known as " A Night at the Garibaldi" with the purpose of providing grants to assist and encourage emerging vocal talent in both the musical theatre and operatic genres. Cav. Rex Da Vanzo, ably assisted by Howard Tong, was the prime organiser and facilitator of these evenings which ended in 2022. Some of New Zealand's top vocal talent (ably supported by many accomplished musicians) made their way to the Garibaldi stage over the years. These included, on the operatic front, *Anna Leese, Shaun Dixon, Isabella Moore, Ana James, Julia Booth, Thomas Atkins, Pasquale Orchard, Emily M'Wila, Andrea Creighton, and, from musical theatre, Chris. Crowe, Matt Pike, Naomi Ferguson, Ali Harper, Will King, Barbara Graham, Tre Belle (now The Sirens), Tim Beveridge, Lydia McDonnell, and Flight of the Conchords (Brett McKenzie and Jermaine Clement)* to name but a few.

In October 2022, the "Last Night at the Garibaldi" was held to farewell this memorable series which had always been supported by sold out audiences.

Club Garibaldi sold the building in 2022 to a development company who plan to redevelop the site. Club Garibaldi has a current lease of the second floor until the end of 2024.

An exhibition of band touring posters from the early 1980s and other ephemera will be on display from 10.30am to 1.30pm on Saturday 20th April. Gold coin entry.

Commencing at 2.00pm-4pm, Club Garibaldi will host a presentation by Rex Da Vanzo and Howard Tong on 30 years of shows from "A Night at the Garibaldi" including never before seen video of these historic performances, followed by afternoon tea. Entry fee \$5.00.

The Last Hurrah

Doors will open at 7.00pm for a glorious night of music presented by the Nick Granville Band featuring some of the busiest and finest musicians playing in New Zealand today. Nick has played guitar around the world including Birmingham Symphony Hall, Liverpool Philharmonic, Indigo at London's O2 Arena, The Monterey Jazz Festival, Typhoon In Los Angeles, The Lighthouse (set for lala land Movie, in Los Angeles and also recorded at United Studios (LA, where MJ did thriller), Kronos (LA) and the most famous studio in the world, Capitol Records. Among the artists Nick has played with are Lalah Hathaway, Dave Weckl, Chris de Burgh, Ronan Keating, Delta Goodrem, Kurt Elling, the NZSO, Orchestra Wellington, The Rodger Fox Big Band, and many more.

Completing the band for us tonight are four outstanding musicians:- Greer Perenara (vocals), Richard Te One (drums), Elliot Fuimaono (bass). They will be playing music with their own contemporary spin, combining Pop, Funk, Soul and Jazz. Expect some explosive playing. This is a gig not to be missed.
