## Can you help? Did you know Aurelio Mereu?



Ciao Everyone!

I am looking for information about my late grandfather and am hoping somebody out there may remember him or the family.

His name was **Aurelio Mereu**, born in 1886 in Sardinia, Italy (region or village unknown, we would love to find out what part of Sardinia he came from). The year he arrived in New Zealand is also unknown to us, but it would have been sometime before 1914.

He married a New Zealander, Doris Mary Emma Sharp on 25 September, 1920. They had five children - Aurelio Thomas (son of the same name, deceased, nickname Sonny), Felice (son, deceased, nickname Filly), Mafalda (daughter, still living but she is 94 years old now and very deaf with little information to add to our search, unfortunately), Nina Francesca (daughter, deceased) and Natalina (daughter, died age 1, 1931). All the children went to Mt Cook School.

They lived at 28 MartIn Square, Newtown, 111 Adelaide Road, Newtown, Richards Street in Titahi Bay and Viking Street in Norsewood, southern Hawke's Bay Aurelio and Doris are buried in Norsewood Cemetery. Aurelio died in 1966, Doris in 1993. He served during the First World War with the Royal New Zealand Navy.

He belonged to the Garibaldi Club and as a child I remember going there, as this was where they purchased food from Italy. Little else is known to me and I am doing the usual searches in hope to gather more information. I am planning a trip to Italy next year and would dearly love to be able to make contact with family or at least visit the place where my grandfather came from.
