Film Festival – Italian Films

Human Capital (Il capital umano) 2014

Two of Italy's leading actresses, Valeria Golino and Valeria Bruni Tedeschi, star in a stylish whodunit based on Stephen Amidon's best-selling book of the same name, expertly intertwining love, class and ambition. The tenuous relationship between two families comes under intense scrutiny in this vivid whodunnit and Italian box office hit. Serena, daughter of a struggling real estate agent, has been going out with Massimiliano, party boy son of a hedge-fund millionaire. Serena's father Dino sees an opportunity in this connection: in Dino, Massimiliano's father Giovanni sees a sucker best avoided. Meanwhile Carla, Giovanni's neglected trophy wife (Valeria Bruni Tedeschi, never better), hopes to endow a theatre restoration with her husband's largesse. The network of characters affected – fatally or otherwise – by this confabulation of desire and money is extensive, and fleshed out with deadly accuracy by a superb cast.

Particle Fever

"Stakes come no higher than in *Particle Fever*, a dazzling, dizzying documentary about nothing less than whether we exist in a coherent universe of ordered, even beautiful laws – or whether, as Princeton physicist Nima Arkani-Hamed theorises, our universe is one of an infinite set of other universes defined by a chaotic mash-up of unstable, inexplicable, random conditions. (The final verdict, unsurprisingly: still out!) The film follows the first proton-smashing experiments conducted in Switzerland's Large Hadron Collider; through compelling interviews with physics theorists and experimentalists, and effervescent science animation.

Sacro GRA

The first documentary ever to be awarded the Golden Lion for Best Film at the Venice Film Festival, *Sacro GRA* wanders the Grande Raccordo Anulare, the gigantic ring road encircling Rome. We are shown into several lives unfolding in houses, apartments and public spaces that line it. Some, including a self-described prince in his amazing kitsch castle, are encountered directly. Others are viewed, though not pruriently, with *Rear Window* fascination.

The Wonders (La Meraviglie) 2014

Italian filmmaker Alice Rohrwacher joined the all-too-small pantheon of women directors honoured at Cannes when Jane Campion's jury awarded the Grand Prix to this aptly titled film. Brava! "A mesmerising coming-of-age tale: small and sweet in every good way, but alive with a power that seems to surge up from deep beneath its sun-roughened landscape... The film is heavily inspired by the director's own childhood in the countryside between Umbria, Lazio and Tuscany. It centres on a German-Italian family of bee-keepers, and particularly 12-year-old Gelsomina (Maria Alexandra Lungu), the eldest of four sisters and the notional heiress to this traditional and increasingly rare way of life...
