Building Report

The coronavirus (Covid-19) has implications on the Club's finances.

The first floor became vacant in January this year, and it is difficult to predict when we will lease it again.

The previous tenant spent a substantial amount on glazed partitioning, which will remain the property of the Club.

Wellington City Council's on-street parking is now free until June, therefore the monthly rental payments from the Club's car parks will reduce temporarily. The hire of the Club's billboards will also decline due to the reduction in general advertising.

With careful budgeting and planning our 'reserve funds' are sufficient to sustain the Club for more than one year.

Things are still unfolding and there is a lot of uncertainty in the future, however later on there will be a return to more favourable economic conditions, and the continuation of Club events and functions.
