Football and celebration

Fine ally!

The 30th anniversary of the Aldo Cuccurullo Memorial Trophy match was played out in beautifully fine conditions at Te Whaea Park, Newtown.

The high-speed tempo of the game defied the warm conditions and both sides started at full tilt.

Things were seemingly very even, but Club Italia went ahead with a very well-taken goal from Gianni Darroch.



Club Garibaldi, stunned by the concession of the goal, redoubled their efforts, and equalised before the break with a wonderful goal from Charlie Hale, who zig-zagged his way through a number of defenders before slamming the ball into the roof of the net.

The second half began like the first, with both sides exhibiting attacking intent at all times. Club Italia pushed forward at every opportunity, and Club Garibaldi pounced via a counter attack, where an excellent run and shot from Tom Da Vanzo was followed up by Anton Di Leva, who turned on the jet-shoes to sprint and stab the ball home to give Club Garibaldi the lead 2-1.

Club Garibaldi extended the margin with another superb goal from Charlie Hale, who, following a mazey run past defenders into the box, effortlessly curled the ball high into the far corner of the Club Italia net. Club Italia just about pulled a goal back but could not quite convert a penalty kick when the penalty kick missed by a matter of inches.

The game ended in a hard-fought 3-1 victory for Club Garibaldi and the Aldo Cuccurullo Memorial Trophy will finally remain in Wellington after a few years down in Nelson, including a mystery disappearance in recent weeks. The well-attended, post-match dinner at The Pines restaurant was fantastic, with wonderful food together with the backdrop of stunning sea views.

Tony Moreno marked the 30th anniversary of these games with the presentation of some beautifully designed medals to the players who took part in the very first game back in 1995. A bus transported Club Italia back into town, where they continued the merriment into the early hours.

A huge thank you to Linda De Gregorio and Club Garibaldi for making the day such a special and pleasurable occasion, and to Rosina Van Der Aa for all of the communications and logistics intel.

We look forward to heading down to Nelson next year to defend the trophy.

Children's Italian Lessons

The Executive has agreed to support the learning of Italian for the children of our members who are **aged between 7 and 16 years old**. This is in association with the Circolo Italiano teacher—led programme.

For the sake of clarity, given possible future changes in the Club's financial circumstances (e.g. the purchase of alternative premises and associated costs) or changes to the Club's Executive Committee (who may have other priorities) the following has been **agreed** by the Executive:

The Club will meet the Circolo Italiano tuition cost of a child of a Club Garibaldi parent who is a current member of the Club for the 2026 academic year, subject to the following restrictions.

To qualify:

- The relationship between the child and its parent does not extend to a grandparent for the purposes
 of this concession; and the child must attend at least 50% of the available Italian language classes on
 offer each term.
- The fee shall be paid in instalments at the end of each term by Club Garibaldi; and this should be regarded as a pilot scheme which will be subject to annual review by the Club before the operating year's end to enable the Circolo to advertise its new classes in good time.

Note: There will be limited spaces available due to the tutor- child ratio.

The Club looks forward to working with Circolo Italiano as a continuation of the good relationship between us in facilitating our cultural objectives.

Parents are invited to apply for places in the usual manner directly to Phyllis Mossman, Vice- President of Circolo Italiano, when the new term starts in 2026. The Italian Film Festival is coming to Wellington 19 November - 14 December. It is being held this year at two venues:


- Roxy Cinema 5 Park Road Miramar from the 19 November -14 December
- The Embassy Theatre 24 Nov 14 Dec.

Tickets for the opening night are \$30 each and provide for Peroni, San Pellegrino, JK14 Prosecco, Pizza from Bongusto. Arrivals from 6.45pm for 7:30pm film screening. The opening film is called **Gloria**!

The Italian Embassy in Wellington officially supports this Festival. The festival has reached its 10^{th} Anniversary.

Rome Comes to Wellington

The exhibition Michelangelo – A Different View is coming to town. Under licence from the Vatican Museums this exhibition offers the most complete and authentic reproduction of Michelangelo's beautiful ceiling frescoes from the Sistine Chapel to be shown outside the Vatican.



The exhibition is at the Wellington Convention and Exhibition Centre (Takina) from 22 December to 8 February 2026. Tickets are available through Stensongroup.com. Early Bird booking costs \$39pp, after 22 December \$45pp.

This exhibition features more than 50 stunning pieces including a life-sized reproduction of The Genesis, famously pained on the Sistine Chapel ceiling.

Every ticket purchased is eligible for a draw to win a trip to Rome for two, including entry to the Vatican Museums and the Sistine Chapel.

Italian Movies

For your interest the Italian movies listed below are on the Rialto Channel in November.

Roberto Rossellini Retrospective – Rialto Film Channel

Rialto Channel in November will be showcasing a beautifully curated retrospective on Roberto Rossellini, a pivotal figure in world cinema and a founding voice in Italian Neorealism.

Highlights in the series include:

- Rome, Open City (1945) a seminal film shot during the Nazi retreat; the cornerstone of Neorealism.
- Paisan (1946) an episodic portrait of war and human connection during Italy's liberation.
- Germany, Year Zero (1948) filmed amid post-Nazi Berlin's ruins; stark and devastating.
- Stromboli (1950) starring Ingrid Bergman, grappling with spiritual isolation and resilience.
- Journey to Italy (1954) often cited as a precursor to modernist cinema.
- The Flowers of St. Francis (1950) poetic simplicity in storytelling and spirituality.
- The films are introduced with new contextual material and presented in newly restored versions where available.

Did you know?

Member Rex Da Vanzo points out that The Post newspaper front page in October paid tribute to the highly successful local band The Waratahs and their induction into the NZ Music Hall of Fame after sharing stages all over the world with some music greats.

Not so well known is that the band started life with a two-year residency (from 1986) at the Cricketers Arms tavern in the building the club currently occupies.
