ITALIAN FESTIVAL NEW ZEALAND REPORT

Well, we have certainly come a long way from the first Italian Festival held at the Petone Settlers Museum in 1995 when numbers were around 1,000 attending. The festival at that time was held in conjunction with the opening of the exhibition ALLA FINE DEL MONDO – The Italians in Wellington and also the launch of the book by Paul Elenio of the same name. This was really the beginning of our Italian community having a recognised strong presence in Wellington.

After a few years the festival became so popular that we decided to move the event to the Overseas Terminal under the guidance of the then President, Cav Gerry May, and now in 2010 we are now moving to another venue, The Westpac Stadium.

The festival, which this year will be in its 16th year, draws crowds of 12-15,000 and showcases the best in Italian food, beverages, products and services to the wider public, plus it is a time for all Italians to celebrate both our culture and our lively and well-respected presence in Wellington.

Because the festival has outgrown its traditional home and, with the plan to convert the Overseas Terminal eventually to apartments, the decision was made to move the festival to the new venue. This will enable us to have a larger number of Italian producers and exporters represented at the festival, which already draws exhibitors of everything from travel and books to fashion. A great variety of entertainment and demonstrations will be featured as well.

This is a new venture for Club Garibaldi and one that will require support form our members. Discussions have already been held with Cav Antonio Cacace, the principal organiser. We will make a cultural stand, as well as having our usual stand advertising the club and its activities, and of course, the wonderful food stall where festival goers have come to find delicious home-baked goodies.

We are now asking members to think about how they can help make this new venture an even greater success. Here are some ways you can help:

- Baking a cake or biscuits, una torta, or dolci. One from each family home would be fantastic!
- Helping on the cultural stand, or serving food and drinks from the club's stall.
- Setting up, collecting of cultural items, and taking down, at the conclusion of the festival.
- Blowing up balloons and hanging up Italian flags and club posters.
- Signing up new members and answering questions about the Club and it's history.

AN ITEM OF INTEREST

Italy has a new entry to its big collection of volcanos after scientists found an underwater volcano that blew its last fire at least 670,000 years ago! "This volcano does not give us any cause for concern" said Massimo Chiappini, a member of the National Geophysics and Vulcanology Institute (INGV) team that found it in the Tyrrhenian Sea, off the Coast of the southern region of Calabria. The middle-sized volcano, which has not yet been named, has a length about 15 kilometres and its summit is 120 metres below the surface of the sea. The team estimated that it became inactive some time between a million and 670,000 years ago. The discovery will soon be presented in a paper in a Journal of Geophysical Research, and takes Italy's volcano tally up to 29. Nine of these are still active, including Stromboli, Sicilian giant Mt Etna, and Mt Vesuvius near Naples, which destroyed the ancient Roman city of Pompeii with an eruption in 79AD.

LEGEND OF THE ITALIAN CORNU



The cornu, cornuto, or cornicello refer to a long, gently twisted horn-shaped Italian amulet of ancient origin. Cornicelli are usually carved out of red coral or made of gold or silver, and were worn as a symbol in ancient times when the moon goddess was worshipped, before the rise of Christianity in Europe, to give protection from the evil eye and to ward off evil. Other superstitions link it to sexual power and good luck. It is often worn with a cross, perhaps for double protection or luck!

The Italian cornu is no longer used for protection today. Rather, it may be used as a good luck charm, a fashion statement or a symbol of pride in one's Italian heritage.
